

## Tell Georgia's 9th District Republicans: Silence on Neo-Nazi "Trump" Event in Dahlonega is Complicity

**Update** 9/8/2019: Yesterday evening, the Lumpkin County Republican Party <u>issued a</u> <u>statement</u> which did not formally endorse but also did not condemn the white supremacist rally in Dahlonega.



**Update** 9/4/2019: After two weeks, <u>Rep. Doug Collins has denounced</u> the white supremacist rally. Still no comment from the Lumpkin County Republican Party.


On September 14, 2019, longtime neo-Nazi and "<u>fourth-generation Klansman</u>" Chester J. Doles aims to hold a "<u>Salute to President Trump" rally</u> in Dahlonega, Georgia. The event is being promoted by the <u>ShieldWall Network</u>, a white supremacist group. It is also promoted on Stormfront, a white power website linked to almost one hundred murders.

The <u>initial invitation</u> for the Dahlonega "Trump" event featured antisemitic imagery. A <u>new flyer</u> has now been produced to better mask the nature of the event. Doles has <u>clearly indicated</u> that the Dahlonega rally aims to intimidate his perceived political enemies in North Georgia, in particular liberal activists who Doles portrays as "antifa". Doles is organizing a "security" team who are readying for violence and has made a <u>special appeal</u> for his old associates from the <u>National Alliance</u> (once the foremost neo-Nazi group in North America) to attend. On Facebook, the Lumpkin County Republican Party <u>appeared to give the Nazi-organized event a nod and a wink</u>, "liking" a comment promoting the rally. The post and the comment have now vanished, but without any clarification from the Republicans.

Doles also <u>used the name of Republican Congressman</u> for Georgia's 9<sup>th</sup> District, Doug Collins, on the initial flyer for the rally, which stressed that Collins has been "invited" to the event. (Chester Doles mistakenly called Collins a "Senator".) We informed Rep. Collins of Chester Doles' past and his neo-Nazi ideology but have received no comment from Collins. <u>Congressman Doug Collins has strongly opposed the characterization of Donald Trump as a "racist"</u>. However, Rep. Collins has not yet denounced a Nazi-organized "Trump" rally in his own Congressional District, a rally which used his name on its advertising.

Silence from local Republicans — while neo-Nazis and white supremacists use "Trump" to recruit — is unacceptable. We ask all anti-racists and community members to contact the Lumpkin County Republican Party, Congressman Doug Collins, and the GOP for Georgia's 9<sup>th</sup> District. Demand that they publicly state their opposition to the neo-Nazi event in Dahlonega, since silence gives the impression of support.

We will continue to update about the Dahlonega situation on <u>our Twitter account</u>, so check for news. In the meantime, please spread the word and demand that Republicans publicly clarify their position on the white supremacist-organized Dahlonega rally.
